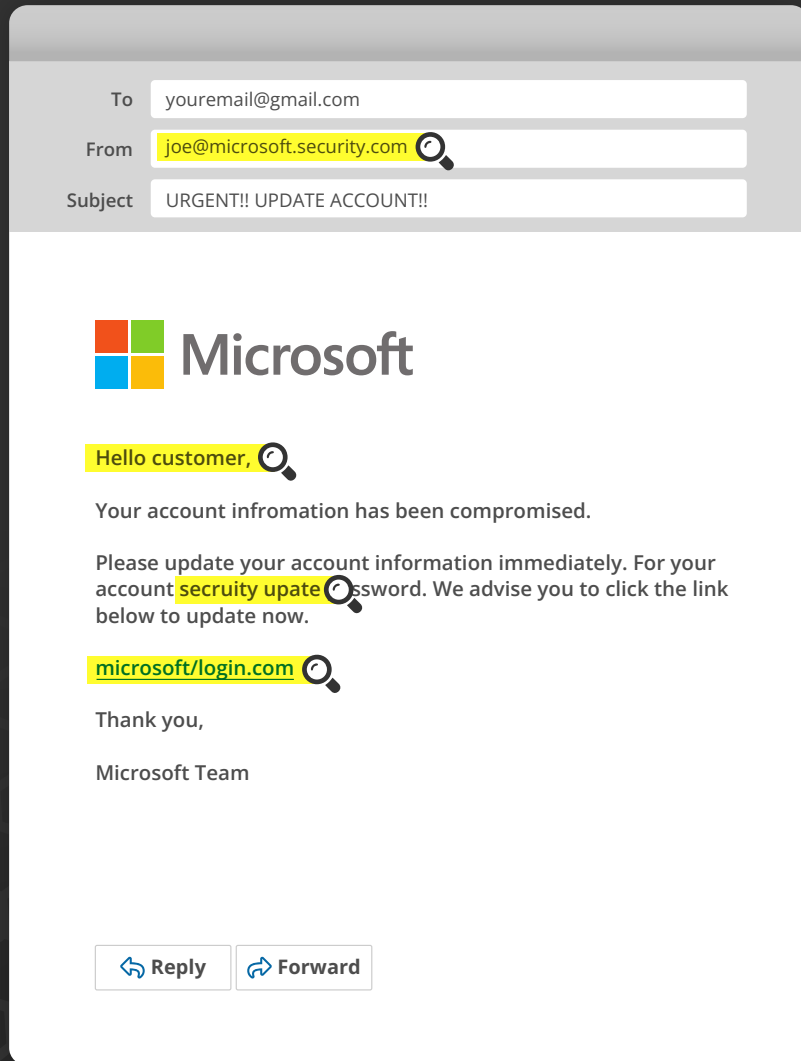







BEWARE OF PRACTICE EMAIL COMPROMISE



Practice Email Compromise (PEC) is a cyberattack where attackers impersonate trusted individuals or organizations through emails to deceive victims into taking actions, such as transferring funds or sharing sensitive information.

RECOGNIZING A PEC ATTACK

-  **Poor spelling, grammar and punctuation**
PEC attempts often contain errors in language usage.
-  **Unusual formatting, appearance or domain**
Be cautious of messages that look different from the sender's typical style or come from random domains.
-  **Non-official email address**
Messages not originating from official email addresses or domains may indicate a PEC attack.
-  **Improper greeting or signature**
Unusual greetings, signatures or contact information could suggest phishing attempts and PEC attacks.
-  **Unusual fund requests**
Payment requests to uncommon addresses through unusual methods should be treated cautiously.



Email-only communication

If the sender avoids other channels of communication, it's suspicious.



Urgency & rushed transactions

PEC attackers create a sense of urgency to manipulate victims into acting hastily.
